The Southwest Air Pollution Control Authority Spring period for residential burning of yard and garden trimmings by the private homeowner in <u>Clark</u> and <u>Cowlitz</u> Counties will end at sundown, June 15, 1988. No burning will be allowed during the summer months within all city limits and Clark County Fire Districts #5 and #6.

Burning of natural vegetation, grown on site, is permitted in the remainder of Clark and Cowlitz Counties as follows: Written burning permits are issued by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) in the remainder of the County Fire Districts, except portions of District #1 and west of 212th Ave. in District #3 of Clark County.

Natural vegetation debris disposal fires less than 10 feet across can be burned, without permit, by following the rules. Contact DNR at toll free 1-800-527-3305, Southwest Region, for burning regulations and written burning permit information.
