Currently the area meets the federal eight-hour air quality health standard for ozone; this proposed Ozone Maintenance Plan demonstrates that the area will continue to meet the standard with existing controls. The public is welcome to comment on this plan beginning Oct. 2, 2006.

This EPA-required plan assures that the AQMA will maintain compliance with the federal eight-hour ozone standard through 2015. The plan also includes a contingency plan in case the area exceeds or violates the federal ozone standard. The original 1996 control strategies already in place are being maintained in the new plan with few changes and no additional control strategies are being proposed in the plan.

The growth allowance for industrial sources will be maintained and is reset proportional to Oregon's growth allowance so that equivalent economic development opportunities will exist on both sides of the Columbia River. The suite of strategies described in the plan will work together to protect the area's air quality as growth and population pressures increase over the next ten years. This Ozone Maintenance Plan will help ensure that the area remains within federal health standards for ozone while accommodating new and expanding businesses and population growth.
