



Comment Notice Issuance of Draft Title V Permit

Action: SWCAA is issuing a draft Air Operating Permit (AOP) for the River Road Generating Plant. The draft AOP is a renewal permit, incorporating applicable requirements from Local, State and Federal regulations.

Facility Description: The River Road Generating Plant is a natural gas fired combined cycle combustion turbine power facility owned by Public Utilities District #1 of Clark County (Clark Public Utilities). The nominal generating capacity of the facility is 248 megawatts (MW). The River Road Generating Plant is currently operated for Clark PUD by a third party under contract.

The facility has five emission units: Combustion Turbine, Startup Boiler, Fuel Gas Heater, Emergency Generator, and Emergency Fire Pump.

Pollutant Discharge: Estimated emissions of criteria and hazardous air pollutants to the ambient air for the year 2022 are as follows:

Project Impact: This action does not change existing permit limits already established in federally enforceable Air Discharge Permits. All applicable requirements for the River Road Generating Plant have been compiled in draft Air Operating Permit SW99-9-R4.
