## **Guide to Commenting**

SWCAA's air permitting authority is limited to the air quality impacts of the proposed pellet mill itself. SWCAA cannot consider or address comments on issues outside the scope of the Agency's air permitting authority. If the proposed project meets all applicable requirements, SWCAA is legally obligated to approve the application. If a proposed project does not meet applicable requirements, SWCAA is required to deny the application. [RCW 70A.15.2210(3)]

## General Tips

- 1. Make your comments easy to read.
- 2. Start with general comments, followed by specific, page-by-page comments.
- 3. If your comments are extensive, include a summary at the beginning of your letter.
- 4. Use headings and / or topic sentences.
- 5. Provide specific examples illustrating your concerns.
- 6. Be clear and specific.
- 7. Make statements supported with facts.
- 8. Offer helpful solutions.
- 9. Suggest specific language changes or additions.
- 10. Provide your contact information at the end of your comments.
